I. INTRODUCTION

The University of California San Diego (University), will be selecting an Executive Architect to perform design, construction drawings, bid and construction administration phase services for the EP Laboratory Equipment Replacement at the, Thornton Hospital UCSDMC, La Jolla Campus. The project will require OSHPD approval.

II. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project scope will consist of, but not be limited to, modernization of the existing EP Lab, Control Room, associated support systems and coordination of work to be provided by the university. The project will be required to conform to the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Time is of the essence for project completion. Due to the sensitivity of adjacent facilities this project may require construction to be accomplished during off-hours.

III. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The scope of services for this project will include basic architectural/engineering services, including field investigation, schematic design, design development, construction documents, cost management, scheduling, agency review through OSHPD, bid/award support, and construction administration services. The University may have CAD backgrounds and or PDF documents available to be utilized as reference for project documentation. Upon selection of the architect a specific scope for this project will be further defined.

IV. JOINT VENTURES/ASSOCIATIONS

The University will not entertain Joint Ventures or Associations on this project.

V. PROJECT DELIVERY METHOD

The project delivery method will be competitive bid-build by select list of Pre-qualified Contractors.

VI. CONSULTANTS

The University is only selecting the Executive Architect at this time. All sub-consultants, such as, but not limited to, structural, mechanical, electrical, plumbing, low voltage systems specialist, etc. will be selected later by the Executive Architect in collaboration with the University.

VII. SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS AND SELECTION CRITERIA

The University requests the following submittal material for use in the selection of a professional design firm to perform the Scope of Services described in Section III.

- A. Demonstrated experience and excellence in design and renovations within operating hospitals and overall experience in California healthcare work, including OSHPD experience.

- B. Demonstrated experience associated with the design and management of EP / Catheterization Laboratories, or similar projects.
- C. Demonstrate experience and abilities to manage consultants and to provide well coordinated construction drawings that maintain project budget and schedule.
- D. Proven technical, cost management, scheduling, and quality control capabilities.
- E. Qualifications of the Principals and Project Team Members, including a clear definition of the primary responsibility of each. OSHPD experience is required for all key members.
- F. Outline of the basic work plan to accomplish the work.
- G. Proximity to the University's Medical Center, La Jolla Campus or proven methodology for video conferencing and internet meetings.
- H. Ability to provide Professional Liability Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence and \$2,000,000 per Project Aggregate.

VIII. STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

All short-listed firms will be required to sign a Statement of Understanding. By signing the document it is acknowledged that a draft copy of the standard Executive Design Professional Agreement (EDPA) has been read, and with reservation of rights, the terms and conditions are generally agreed upon. Additionally, notwithstanding this is a qualification based selection process, it is understood that fees for basic services are expected to fall within a limited and commercially reasonable range for work as referenced in the Executive Design Professional/Fee Guideline provided to short-listed candidates.

IX. PROCEDURES FOR SUBMISSION

Architectural firms wishing to be considered should submit electronic materials, under a coversheet, indicating their past experience in the programming and renovation of university healthcare buildings or other comparable institutional facilities including references, Standard Forms 330, University of California Consultant Experience Form (Attachment A) and University Statement of Qualifications (Attachment B). One electronic copy on CD or flash drive, in pdf format, should be submitted, with any graphic images, spreadsheets or pages larger than 8.5” x 11” submitted in landscape view. Submit your CD or flash drive with a hard copy transmittal, including your company’s name, and reference the appropriate project name and number. Emailed submissions will not be accepted and no paper copies of the submittal are requested. Proposals are due no later than 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, December 15, 2015.
